Recent Highlights

Sport

Our Sports department has been ranked in the top ten independent schools for sport for the second year running. We are eighth overall in the UK and the third best girls' school nationwide. The ranking – conducted by *School Sport Magazine* – reflects competitive achievements in a range of sports throughout 2017.

In other sporting news, we are delighted to report the outstanding success of our School Ski team at the Independent Schools' Ski Championships held in Les Deux Alpes back in December. Our girls dominated both at team and individual level and were crowned overall team champions. This was followed by further success at national level at the British Schoolgirls' Ski Racing Championships in Flaine in January. The A Team came second overall, demonstrating once again great determination and spirit during the four days of intense training and competition.





Drama

Recent performances have included *Little Voice, King Lear, Blue Remembered Hills,* and *Grimm Tales.* Our girls also excelled in the LAMDA examinations, achieving 24 Merits and an impressive 81 Distinctions.

Music

As well as performing in the magnificent St John's Smith Square in London earlier in the year, our musicians also enjoyed the delights of performing in Rome and Sorrento last summer. A particular highlight included a concert at St Peter's Basilica.



Two brand new boarding houses

We are thrilled to have opened two brand new boarding houses in September 2017. The new houses are now home to more than 100 girls and six members of staff, along with their families (and other animals!). The accommodation offers both single rooms and dormitories for up to four pupils. Each room has ensuite facilities and the building also comprises two living rooms, two kitchens, six study rooms and four music practice rooms.



Lectures

In September, the BBC's ex-Chief News Correspondent Kate Adie visited the School to tell of her own experiences over her 40-year career in journalism.

In January, we welcomed conservationist Sacha Dench to tell of her journey tracking the flight of the Bewick Swans from their breeding grounds in Arctic Russia to the wetlands of Gloucestershire. Unbelievably, she actually flew the 4,500-mile journey with the swans using a paramotor! Dame Helen Ghosh, Director-General of the National Trust, one of the largest charities in the country, spoke about her careers in the Civil Service and NT, steering the strategic conservation of historic properties, beautiful landscapes and natural coastline. The talk was one of Dame Helen's final public appearances in her current role before moving to become the first female and first non-academic Master of Baliol College, Oxford.

Model United Nations

Our Model United Nations teams go from strength to strength and we have attended an increasing number of conferences, including an extremely successful event hosted by Lady Eleanor Holles School. As well winning the Outstanding Delegation Award, six Wycombe Abbey girls also won individual prizes for the standard of their contribution to the debate.



Oxbridge Offers

Whilst the application process for 2018 university entry is far from over, we are delighted to announce that 29 Wycombe Abbey girls have received offers from Oxford and Cambridge Universities, with 14 girls gaining places at Cambridge and 15 at Oxford – the highest number of offers from Oxford in the past seven years.

New international school to open in China

Wycombe Abbey International and BE Education held a groundbreaking ceremony in Hangzhou, China at the end of January to mark the start of construction of a second Wycombe Abbey International school, expected to open in September 2020.


A level results

Careers Guidance

Wycombe Abbey aims to inspire, inform and support girls in preparing for rewarding and successful careers. The whole school is involved in our 'Breaking the Mould' events featuring inspirational speakers; these have included a commercial pilot, stand-up comedian, vicar, hostage negotiator, structural engineer and a jewellery designer. Additional events include Careers Spotlights on particular industries, most recently on Computer Science and Architecture and our Careers Seminar, with more than 20 speakers talking about their specific career paths. Girls are encouraged and supported to undertake work experience placements and we are able to network with Seniors and Parents to provide an increasing number of opportunities. Every girl in the Sixth Form attends the Management Conference and Leadership Conference, enabling them to acquire valuable employability skills. Wycombe Abbey is also a member of Futurewise, which offers an array of courses spanning career areas from law and medicine through to journalism and media.
