Wycombe Homeless Connection is a registered charity founded in 2007 which serves around 500 homeless or vulnerably-housed individuals each year. The charity's overall aim is to help people rebuild their lives by assisting them not only with accommodation but also to develop skills to live independently and take part in the community. The Wycombe sleep out happened earlier this year in order to raise awareness of the difficulties faced by homeless people. The sixth form girls took part to show their support for the people facing said difficulties and raised £2527 for Wycombe Homeless Connection.
